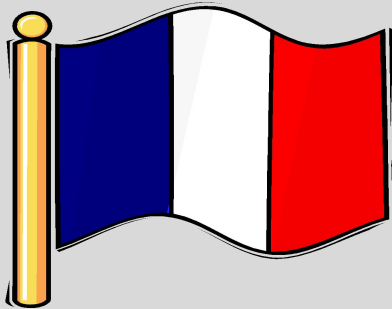

Student Schedules



- Conway High School has seven instructional periods a day.
 - Each student must have at least six academics classes per day
- OR
- Each student must have five academic classes and an athletic period each day
 - Students are only allowed to have ONE study hall per day.

CONCURRENT CLASSES-11th and 12th



- UCA CLASSES TAUGHT ON OUR CAMPUS
- Must have 20 Composite and 19 in Reading on ACT
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better
- Cost set by UCA and billed by UCA (currently ten dollars a credit hour)
- Offerings Include:
 - College Writing I & II (6 hours and two credits)-Senior year only
 - Must have 19 on ACT in English
 - College Algebra (3 hours and one credit) - 19 on ACT in Math
 - Oral Communications (3 hours and one credit)
 - Orientation to Teaching (6 hours and two credits)

AP Testing for College Credit



- Students enrolled in an AP class will take an AP exam at the end of each course ****If a student does not show up for the exam, there is a \$15.00 fee.***
- If a student drops an AP course after November 15th, there is a **\$40.00 fee.**
- If a student scores a three or higher, student will earn college credit/hours for that course.

PreAP/AP Indicators of Success



- Maintain 85% or above in subject area during current and previous year
- Scored “Ready” or “Exceeding” on ACT Aspire in subject area
- **Self-motivated, organized, and independent** with assignments and homework
- Attendance is not a problem
- Extended academic support beyond the school setting

What If I Fail a Class?

- ◎ If it is required for graduation, you have to make it up in summer school or **credit recovery** (limited space in CR lab).
- ◎ Summer school costs \$150 per $\frac{1}{2}$ credit.
- ◎ Seniors are given priority in CR lab

Schedule Change Process



- Teachers may NOT be selected
- No classes will be changed after the 5th day of a new semester other than a student dropping a class for a study hall (provided the student does not already have a study hall)
- Dropping any class after the first four weeks will result in “WF” for that semester in the course.

Schedule Change Process continued .



- Changing from a PreAP/AP class will only be considered at the end of the first five weeks, first nine weeks, and at semester only. **Space must be available. There will be a \$40.00 fee for dropping an AP class after November 15th.**
- Students enrolled in a full year elective course will remain in that course for the full year unless semester grade is below a C and parent approves schedule change.
